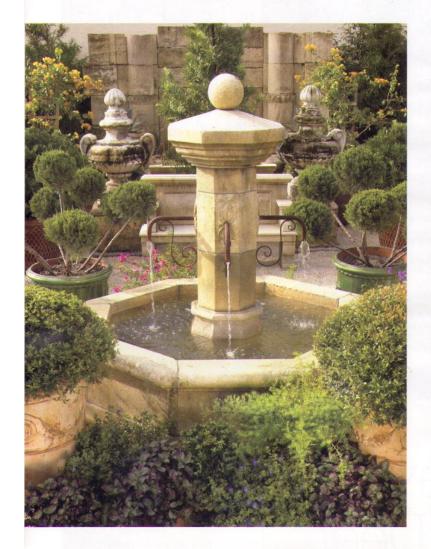
oted architect Luis Barragán once said,
