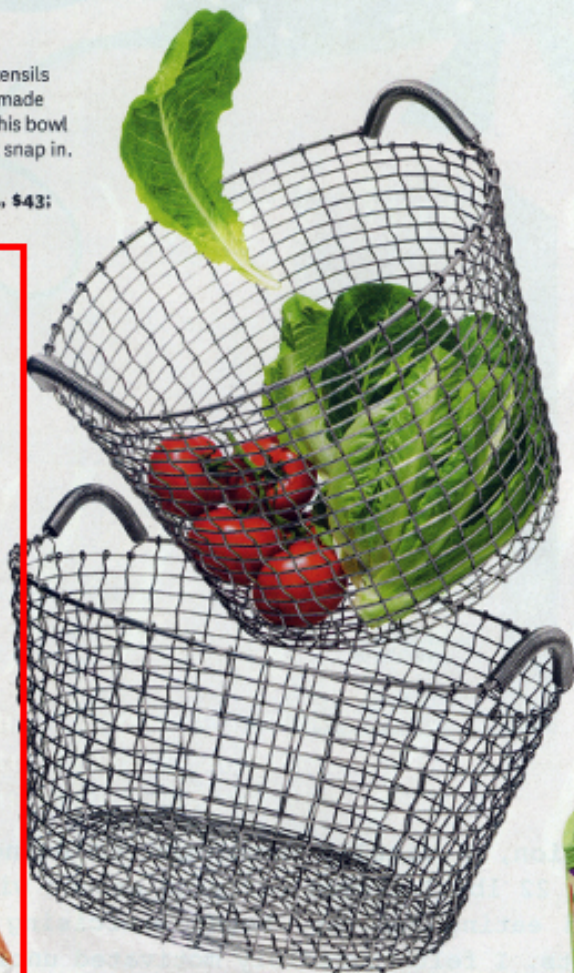
◀ Lettuce Entertain You
